I did a presentation in Medford to the southern Oregon Autism Society and they are eager to receive their blankets.



Quick and Easy Tying Solution: When tying a quilt, thread the needle with yarn or crochet thread and then, rather than cutting and recutting yarn from the spool or skein, simply pull the yarn through as you make your stitches at **6" increments across the quilt. You can easily stitch across the quilt** - then cut your yarn half way between each "tie", tie them off and begin a new row. This eliminates the constant stopping to cut more yarn and makes this step much faster and easier.
