- Tip of the Week:** Use sizing when you press your fabrics before rotary cutting and to stabilize bias edges. I like Mary Ellen's Best Press Caribbean scent (nothing annoys me more than to only be able to use spray starch for a few times before the spray nozzle breaks!) The best press or the sizing will give you a nice crispness to the fabrics which will make it easier to cut.
